Franz Pfeiffer Sc. Fuldae*; (25)ff. signed A–C<sup>2</sup> D<sup>2+1</sup> E–M<sup>2</sup> and paginated 1–16 (2, interpolated leaf ‘Facies IV’) 17–48, with woodcut ornaments; plus two plates signed by Pfeiffer of the *castrum doloris* (platemarks 395 × 310mm); (13)ff. signed A–B<sup>2</sup> C1, A–C<sup>2</sup> [D<sup>2</sup>] and paginated 1–10, 1–13 (3), with woodcut head-piece ‘Heute an mir, morgen an dir’, and typographical tail-piece. The versoes of D1 and D2 are blank; as the same text appears on both rectoes, D2 was meant to be cancelled by the binder.

BOUND in a contemporary wrapper of floral *Bronzefirmispapier* on black ground

**A** *Sammelband* gathering three publications concerning the obsequies for Amandus (Friedrich Franz Ludwig) von Buseck, Fürstbischof of Fulda, who had died at three o'clock in the morning of 4 December 1756, at his Schloß Fasanerie-Adolphseck, was embalmed the same day, afterwards transferred to Fulda, and interred on 13 December 1756 in Fulda Domkirche. His obsequies were twice postponed: first, until after the election of his successor, Fürstbischof Adalbert von Walderdorff (17 January 1757), then again to enable the attendance of distinguished guests.<sup>1</sup>

The first work in the volume is the *Leichenpredigt* delivered on 10 March 1757 by Johann Kolbinger, a monk of the Benedictine abbey of Ottobeuren, and professor of canon law at Fulda,<sup>2</sup> who took as his text 2 Kings 12:25, ‘Vocavit nomen ejus, Amabilis Domino, eo quod diligeret eum Dominus’ (Vulgata Clementina). Our copy is illustrated by a large folding plate not ordinarily present, depicting the *Trauergerüst* erected in the Kapelle des Residenzschlosses, on which the corpse had reposed three months previously.

The second work is a anonymous description of the *castrum doloris* erected in March 1757 in the crossing of the Domkirche, explicating its numerous emblems of mourning, transcribing lemmas and other inscriptions, with two large plates signed by the same print-

maker, J[ohann?] Franz Pfeiffer of Fulda. The third work combines a ‘seating plan’ of those present with the text of the ‘Lob- und Danck-Rede’ delivered on 10 March 1757 by Chancellor Johann Weizell.
